

MJFC 438: Film & TV Practicum

Facilitates the student's transition from college to the entertainment industry. Focus of the class will be skills training in topics related to the identification and acceptance of employment opportunities, career development and techniques for upward mobility within the field of film and television production. Students obtain a supervised internship in a professional setting and work for a total of 120 hours for the Fall or Spring semester. Summer internships (60 hours) must be pre-approved by instructor.
