

SOCI 113: Crime & Just.: Behind the wall

A unique experiential learning opportunity that brings together students to learn about and discuss topics such as the causes of crime, victims, rationale of the criminal justice system, restorative justice, the prison industrial complex and the cradle to prison pipeline. Through reading and dialogue, inside (incarcerated or detained) and outside (HU campus) students will be able to integrate their theoretical knowledge with lived experiences.
